

Brandywine Summit Camp Meeting Ground Rules

Since Brandywine Summit Camp Meeting grounds are dedicated to the Worship of God and for the recreation of His people, the following rules were prepared to ensure the effective carrying out of this purpose. The sale of any cottage is subject to the signed agreement by the buyer to abide by these rules.

1. Cottagers are expected to attend services. It is expected that all persons on ground will attend the services and programs.
2. Modest clothing shall be worn on the grounds.
3. Quiet must be maintained 30 minutes before and after all services, and between 11 pm and 8 am.
4. Smoking is not permitted on the grounds, except in the privacy of your own cottage.
5. Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs are forbidden on the grounds.
6. Cats and dogs must be kept on a leash. The animal's owner must remove excrement.
7. Major construction during meetings, extended weekends, Camp events, and on Sundays is forbidden without specific permission of the Grounds Chairman.
8. Camp musical instruments shall be used only with permission of the Program Committee.
9. Children shall not play in the Tabernacle at any time.
10. There shall be no open fires on the grounds without approval of the Grounds Committee.
11. The speed limit of 14 miles per hour and the one way on the Camp road will be enforced for all motor vehicles, bicycles, and wheeled toys. PA State Laws will be in effect on the grounds. Helmets for pedalcyclers, under age 12, is mandatory in PA.
12. Firearms are forbidden on grounds.
13. Motorcycles, automobiles, or horses are not allowed on the avenues, walkways, or paths except to transport persons unable to walk or to carry heavy or bulky objects. Vehicles shall be parked in designated areas and with consideration of others' needs. Fire lanes must be kept open. Tricycles or "Big Wheels" shall be used only in Asbury Park or on Asbury and Brandywine Avenues, when accompanied by an adult. Any type of skates or skateboards are not to be used on grounds, for the safety of all concerned.
14. No dumping of any kind is permitted on grounds.
15. Trash and garbage, properly wrapped in trash bags, must be placed in the containers provided and the lids secured. Cottage owners should arrange with the Grounds Committee for the cost of removing large, bulky items that do not fit in the containers. This service is not covered by the grounds assessment and must be paid for separately. Nothing can be left outside of the dumpsters. Absolutely no wood is to be placed in the dumpsters.
16. Trees shall not be planted or removed without approval of the Grounds Committee.
17. Cottages can not be occupied from October 15th through April 15th, except as specified by the Board.
18. Single persons under 21 years of age are not permitted to occupy cottages alone without adult supervision.
Unrelated and unmarried persons of the opposite sex are not permitted to live together in cottages.
19. The Association cannot be held responsible for damage to a cottage or its contents. The cottage owner should secure proper theft and vandalism insurance.

20. Complaints and work orders should be directed to the Grounds Committee. The maintenance person is responsible only to the Grounds Committee and is not to be given orders by cottage owners.
21. It is expected that cottages will be maintained in a condition that will be an asset to the Camp.
22. No cottage shall be used, rented, or sold for the purpose of storage.
23. If any cottage is not occupied for a period of two consecutive years or maintained in a useable and presentable condition, the Board may, at its discretion, take the cottage.
24. Each cottage owner is responsible for raking the leaves and cleaning the area around their cottage by May 1, and participate in at least two of the four scheduled workdays each spring and fall.
25. Dump stations must be used for all portable toilets and commodes. Use a hose to wash the area after every use. **TOILETS SHALL NOT BE USED FOR THIS PURPOSE.**
